



Announcement of the Office for National Education Standards and Quality Assessment (Public Organization)

Subject: Policy on the Non-Acceptance of Gifts or Any Kind of Tokens of Appreciation from Official Duties for Fiscal Year 2025

In accordance with the Cabinet's resolution dated January 7, 2007, which approved the policy regarding the giving of gifts to senior government officials or supervisors, it was decided that greeting cards or signing in a congratulatory book should be used instead, especially prohibiting the collection of funds among government officials or using any public welfare funds to procure gifts. Furthermore, it is mandated that political officials and senior government officers set an example by refraining from accepting gifts and ensuring their subordinates follow this policy. Violation of this Cabinet resolution is considered a disciplinary offense for both the giver and the recipient. This is further outlined in the Constitution Act on Anti-Corruption B.E. 2561, the Office of the Prime Minister's regulation on giving or receiving gifts by state officials B.E. 2544, the National Anti-Corruption Commission's announcement on the guidelines for accepting property or benefits under public morality B.E. 2563, and the Civil Servant Ethics Code, which defines clear guidelines, measures, and practices regarding the giving or receiving of gifts or benefits by state officials.

To support anti-corruption and ethical behavior within government sectors, and to ensure clarity regarding the giving and receiving of gifts by senior government officials on special occasions, the purpose is to announce that all executives and staff members of the Office for National Education Standards and Quality Assessment (Public Organization) will not accept any form of gifts or tokens of appreciation at any time before, during, or after official duties that could lead to corruption or unethical behavior. Therefore, as a government agency, all personnel at every level within the organization are hereby instructed to "not accept gifts or rewards of any kind from official duties," and to express goodwill on various occasions using methods such as greeting cards, signing in a congratulatory book, sending well-wishes through social media, or participating in volunteer work as alternatives to giving gifts. If gifts or souvenirs are to be given according to public morality or customary practices to maintain good relationships and friendships, they may be accepted provided they do not exceed 3,000 baht per person per occasion and are in compliance with the Cabinet resolution and related regulations.
